2014-2015 Course Selection Timeline

January 24 - February 7 Curriculum information will be presented in English and US History classes.

Wednesday, January 29 Grade 9 parent and student meeting for career, college, and curriculum information night. Friday, February 14

Course selection sheets and any applications (JELCC, Early Release, etc.) due in Period 3 and signed by parents.

Beginning in February, counselors will meet with students individually to plan courses that meet career and educational goals expressed by the student. Any adjustments in courses previously selected by parents and students will be made at that time. In May, students will receive a list of courses they have requested. Students will be allowed to make any changes by returning the course requests at that time. After that time, requests for changes will not be allowed, except for semester failures and classes taken during summer school.

Parents and students are asked to give careful attention to the classes requested this spring. Student requests determine the school's master schedule and staffing needs and fees are not adjusted for drop/add. Parents are encouraged to contact the assigned counselor for information or to make an appointment to discuss these important decisions.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

FAFSA is used by college and university financial aid offices to determine eligibility for grants, low-interest loans, college work-study program and sometimes scholarships. Indiana colleges generally require the form to be **filed** by March 10 of the senior year, but some out-of-state colleges have earlier deadlines. Be sure to check the priority date for your schools of interest. Applying after deadlines could mean loss of funds.

Filing Tips:

- Seniors and parents can request PIN's now (www.pin.ed.gov).
- Complete your tax forms early, you'll need them to file.
- File online: www.fafsa.ed.gov
- Read and follow the instructions.
- Print a copy for your college files. •
