From the Principal . . .

Dear Parents:

Periodically it's a good idea to review with students and parents the various practices and procedures employed at North Central High School. Basically, the school "turns over" its student population every 4 years. Since our school population (students and parents) is dynamic and changing, I need to remind myself not to assume that you know how things are done just because some of us are dinosaurs and know that is how it's always been. This issue will deal with attendance and make-up work.

Attendance is the most critical factor in school success for a student! Students need to be in every class, every day. Every school study ever done substantiates the positive correlation between school attendance and school success. No question! Be here!

Having said that, I also know some absences cannot be avoided. When those absences occur, they can be classified as either excused or unexcused. Listed below are the procedures and practices for make-up work:

MAKE-UP WORK

When a student is absent from a class there are definite procedures to follow relative to make-up work depending upon the nature of the absence, i.e., excused, unexcused or prearranged.

ABSENCES

For state reporting, absences from school are counted as periods missed: 1 - 3 class periods missed counts as 1/2 day absence.

4 - 7 class periods missed counts as a full day of absence from school. Students who are absent for any reason are expected to obtain assignments from North Central's Homework Hotline. The number to call is 259-5355, then your teacher's extension. You may obtain your teacher's telephone extension on the Internet by entering <u>www.NCHS.cc</u>, go to Contact Us and click School Directory.

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance of students is essential and expected at all times. When it is necessary to be absent from school all day, the parent/guardian is to call the school--259-5355 extension 45555--and notify the attendance secretary the reason for the absence. These calls are to be made every day of absence, preferably between 7:00 and 10:00 a.m. Voice-mail messages are encouraged prior to 7:00 a.m. Calls received after 3:00 p.m. or the following day may result in an unexcused absence.

A student is not counted as absent when the student:

- 1. participates in school-sponsored field trips.
- 2. observes a major religious holiday.
- 3. has to appear in court.
- 4. is scheduled to take the driver's road test for the first time.
- 5. is incarcerated.
- 6. is suspended from class or school.
- 7. serves as a page in the state legislative body.

8. is working at any general, city, township, special, or primary election. Excused absences are granted for all reasons stated by Indiana Attendance Statutes and School Board policies--they are as follows: the student's illness, serious illness of an immediate member of the family, or death of an immediate member of the family. Credit for work missed during an excused absence will be recorded at full credit. Students receive two days to make up work for each day of excused absences. Credit for work missed during an unexcused absence will be recorded at a rate of 75% of the earned grade. Credit for work missed by a student who has been marked truant will be recorded as 0. Students who have completed a pre-arranged absence form or a student who is incarcerated may receive full credit for work completed during those absences.

Prearranged absences are discouraged and will not be granted during nine weeks tests or semester exams. Prearranged absences may not be granted to extend a holiday or vacation break.

PREARRANGED ABSENCES

If a student needs to be out of town for a wedding, religious conference, family vacation, or absent for any reason which does not constitute an excused absence, a Prearranged Absence Form (pink) is required. The form may be picked up from attendance personnel prior to the dates absent. There will be no provision for prearranged absences during the final week of any grading period or for any class during summer school. There are also no prearranged absences during the week of, prior to, or following a school vacation period.

The form requires signatures of a parent/guardian, an assistant principal, and any teacher whose class will be missed. Homework assignments may be given prior to the absence, or upon the student's return, at the individual teacher's discretion. The homework/assignment section of the form will be returned to the student upon receipt of the signed form. Make-up work for full credit is granted in the prearranged category. A student must have the prearranged absence form completed **three (3)** days prior to his/her absence in order for make-up work to be granted for credit.

It is the decision of the school administrator to determine if a prearranged absence will be granted. This is a privilege. It is not a right. Students who have poor grades (do not meet the standards of participation) or have poor attendance may be refused a prearranged absence. Long term prearranged absences are generally not approved.

TARDINESS

Students arriving to school after 7:25 a.m. should report to the attendance office. Students late to school due to an excused reason will be sent immediately to class from the attendance office. Students late to school for an unexcused reason will be detained in the Tardy Room until the end of the period. Tardiness due to a student's bus arriving late is excused. Tardiness due to oversleeping, car trouble, etc. is not excused. Students who drive may lose their driving privileges for tardies to school. Students with four (4) tardies to school will be suspended pending a parent/guardian conference.

Students who are tardy to class after having attended one or more classes are to report directly to the Tardy Room (B118). Students are allowed three (3) tardies to class per semester. Students will be suspended pending a parent/guardian conference on their fourth (4) tardy.

The building is large and there are many students passing to classes. Students neither have time to socialize between class periods nor the time to return to their locker after each class. With a little planning and a conscientious effort, every student can be on time.

Please review the above procedures and practices with your child. Thank you.

2014 AP EXAM REGISTRATION

Students enrolled in AP courses are expected to sit for AP exams in May. Students should register and pay fees for AP tests online between MARCH 3-7. Should students need to register late for ANY reason, they may do so the week of March 10-14 for an additional \$50.00 PER TEST IN ADDITION TO THE STANDARD TEST FEE. Scholarships will be forfeited if the registration is late. All tests are \$89 or \$15 depending on the subject matter. There are two ways to register and pay fees for AP exams:

Students paying full price for AP exams and those students who 1) qualify for free or reduced lunch will register and pay fees for AP tests online at mypaymentsplus.com before midnight, March 7.

- OR -

2) Students who apply for and receive a scholarship to defray the cost of AP exams must obtain an AP registration form from the Guidance Office, then register and pay fees for AP tests in the Guidance Office during lunch periods only, March 3-7, paying with check, money order or cash.

**Credit card payments are accepted only online.

NO REGISTRATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER MARCH 7 WITH-OUT A \$50 ADDITIONAL FEE PER TEST. NO EXCEPTIONS!
