2014-15 Scheduling

NOTABLE NEWS . . .

Indiana State Department of Health Minimum Requirements for School Entry for 2014-2015

For Grades 6-12:

5 doses of diphtheria-tetanusacellular pertussis (DTaP), diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (DTP), or pediatric diphtheria-tetanus vaccine (DT) (4 doses are acceptable if the 4th dose was administered on or after the 4th birthday and at least 6 months after the 3rd dose). 4 doses of any combination of IPV or OPV by age 4-6 (3 doses of all OPV or all IPV are acceptable if the 3rd dose was administered on or after the 4th birthday).

3 doses of Hepatitis B vaccine (3rd dose must be on or after 24 weeks of age).

2 doses of measles (rubeola) vaccine on or after the first birthday. 2 doses of mumps vaccine on or after the first birthday.

1 dose of rubella (German measles) vaccine on or after the first birthday. 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine on or after the first birthday separated by age-appropriate interval or written history of disease. Parental history of chickenpox disease is acceptable proof of immunity. A signed written statement from the parent/guardian indicating month and year of disease is sufficient.

1 dose of tetanus-diphtheria-acellular pertussis vaccine (Tdap) given on or after 10 years of age.

1 dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV4). 2 doses of meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV4)
