Register with NAVIANCE

North Central College Counseling Office encourages all students to register with NAVIANCE Family Connection, an internet-based college search, comparison and application program. Juniors and seniors will find it the most helpful, but freshmen and sophomores can use it to begin their college planning and career exploration and to begin building resumes.

Using NAVIANCE requires:

A current e-mail address (please notify the Guidance Office of new e-mail addresses)

A registration code, which will be e-mailed to students (also available in the Guidance Office).

Once you have your registration code, enter the address:

http://connection.naviance.com/northcentral and register as a new user on the upper right side of the screen.

Juniors and seniors will use the program to sign up for meetings with college representatives visiting North Central in the fall. Just log in, click on the 'College' tab, and then click on 'view all upcoming college visits' on the left. As the visits are scheduled, they will appear under 'College, Visits.'

Class of 2014

Congratulations to our graduating class of 2014, 650, or 88% of the class, achieved a Core 40 diploma. Earning a Core 40 diploma means being solidly prepared for college by going beyond basic graduation requirements to take a second year of Algebra and a year of Chemistry or Physics. The state average for graduates earning a Core 40 is 65%. The class of 2014 had 39% of its seniors earning the Indiana Academic Honors diploma by adding one additional year of advanced Mathematics, 3 years of a World Language, a year of Fine Arts, and maintaining a 3.0 or above grade point average. In addition, 29% of the class earned North Central Honors which required them to take the equivalent of 20 semesters of advanced placement classes while satisfying the above requirements for an Indiana Academic Honors diploma and maintaining a 3.0 or above grade point average. The rigorous International Baccalaureate program was completed by 30 students. We are thrilled that North Central's Class of 2014 stepped up to the challenge and successfully completed rigorous academics that are above and beyond the basic requirements.

ALL GRADE LEVELS: Concerned About College Costs?

NC families are eligible to receive FREE personalized advice on making college affordable through the **National Center for College Costs (NCCC)**. An NCCC representative will be available at **Backto-School Night** on **Monday, August 18**, to answer questions about paying for college and to explain their college cost estimator. A **follow-up workshop will be held on Tuesday, December 4**, at which time individualized reports will be returned to families explaining the awarding of all types of aid as it relates to personal financial profiles. There is a financial planning charge of \$5 to all freshmen to become client families of the NCCC (included in general fees). Parents: Three Important Opt-outs

- Internet usage forms signed by parents are no longer required. Use of the internet will be allowed for all students unless parents state in writing to the principal that they DO NOT wish their student to have internet access.
- 2) Seniors' names and social security numbers will be included in a report to the State Student Assistance Commission of Indiana in April 2015 verifying that they have earned a Core 40 and/or Indiana Academic Honors diploma, allowing them to receive state financial aid for college. Parents who DO NOT want their senior's name or social security number released to SSACI for financial aid eligibility must put that request in writing to the student's counselor
- 3) A provision in the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) requires schools to provide the military with student names and contact information. If you do not want your child's name released, please contact North Central High School's Registrar, Jane White, 259-5355 ext. 45336 or jewhite@msdwt.k12.in.us.


