Did you know it is illegal in Indiana to put electronic items in the trash? In January of 2012, it became illegal to dispose of anything with a cord in the trash or a landfill. **The North Central Recycling Club,** in conjunction with **Recycleforce, Inc.** and **Wings for West Africa,** is sponsoring a computer and electronic (e-waste) collection drive. Usable computer equipment will be refurbished and shipped to schools in Senegal, West Africa. (Hard drives will be professionally wiped.) Unusable items will be disassembled and recycled. MYP Information From Ms. Sisson......

Student-directed *inquiry* is at the heart of the MYP classroom. Based on the work of Kathy G. Short, professor at the University of Arizona, inquiry is understood as a process in which students are moved from their current level of understanding to a new and deeper level of understanding. At first, the teacher can initiate this process; however, the expectation is that students will ultimately take responsibility for and guide their own inquiries.

Inquiry is difficult to define as it is a stance and a concept rather than a practice and a skill. Inquiry informs how teachers approach their teaching and their curriculum. In an inquiry classroom, curricular understanding does not become an end in itself. Instead, understanding piques curiosity and raises more questions. Further, inquiry emphasizes the big ideas- the concepts- to which the curriculum points. Concepts have interdisciplinary and real world application. The result: students see how what they do in a particular class not only relates to other classes but to the world outside of the classroom as well. The ultimate goal of inquiry is for students to be problemposers as well as problem-solvers. Thus, armed with the knowledge students gain from their academic studies and the skills they learn as a result of participating in classes in which inquiry occurs, NCHS students will be well equipped to manage the complex world at large.

Seniors: An Important "Early Decision" Deadline

Seniors who apply for college admission through **Early Decision** (binding commitment) programs are required to submit "back up" applications to their counselor by **December 2**. Early Decision applicants who are deferred into the regular candidate pool or denied admission are released from the Early Decision binding agreement. Avoid the additional stress of being without a "Plan B". Submit your back-up college applications now! Any student who submits a completed application **on or prior to December 1** is assured that his/her application will be processed and mailed prior to winter break. **Applications received after December 1 will be processed and mailed after winter break**. College Resource Room

College-bound students and their parents are invited to take advantage of the college resources available in the Guidance Department. Flip through helpful college guides, access college search site programs from the computers, and help yourself to college information in the file cabinets. The College Resource Room (L258B) is accessible throughout the school day and after school until 4:00 p.m.

College Scholarships Available

The Guidance Office receives scholarship materials throughout the year. Stop by Mrs. Stroke's office and help yourself to information on scholarship opportunities offered by institutions, corporations, and community groups. Seniors may also visit NAVIANCE for a complete up-to-date listing of scholarships. Feel free to contact the Guidance Office with questions.

Applying to Colleges

College application processing forms are available on the south wall of the Guidance Office near the Student Center entrance.

REQUIRED - The process has been simplified this year and the only **REQUIRED** form is the PINK SHEET. Seniors must submit one of these Application Cover Sheets for <u>each</u> college application. A parent or guardian must sign the back on just one **PINK SHEET** giving us permission to release their student's records. There is a \$1 processing fee for each Pink Sheet.

OPTIONAL - These forms may be requested by a student's counselor and/or teachers to aid in writing letters of recommendation.

- 1. The WHITE SHEET Student Information Sheet w/details on honors, activities, work, etc.
- The YELLOW SHEET Counselor Recommendation Worksheet
 The GREEN SHEET Teacher Recommendation Worksheet
- Students must hand those forms to their sourcelor IN PERSON for processing. Place

Students must hand these forms to their counselor $\underline{\text{IN PERSON}}$ for processing. Please allow a minimum of two weeks for your counselor to process these materials.

Important Reminders When Applying Online

- ⇒ North Central Guidance Counselors require the Pink Application Cover Sheet for every online application.
- ⇒ Seniors who need letters of recommendation must submit the proper North Central paper recommendation forms to their counselors and teachers for recommendations to be written and mailed. NO EXCEP-TIONS!
- ⇒ Request your electronic transcript at <u>www.parchment.com</u> (no code is needed). This process should be free.

Ask your counselor if you need clarification.
