#### The Summer Challenge Art Program 2015

Art classes, taught by experienced North Central art teachers, will offer high school students with a serious interest in art a chance to work in a conceptual approach.

The program will focus on drawing, painting, design, and computer generated art. Art assignments will be developed to help students work in techniques and fundamentals as well as allow students to use their creative license in making art.

The Summer Challenge Art Program is open to students entering grades 9, 10, 11, and 12. Graduating seniors with a serious interest in art can also apply.

The Summer Challenge Art Program **is not** a summer school class. Students will not receive credit for attending the program. The Summer Challenge Art Program students will meet in the Art Department at North Central High School daily from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm, with an hour for lunch. Students receive approximately 25 hours of instruction. The cost of the program is \$145. This includes the cost of materials and supplies. The class will be limited to 20 students. Students are responsible for providing their own lunch, and are not permitted to leave campus for lunch unless prior permission has been given by parent or guardian.
