



THE COLLEGE HANDBOOK

The College Handbook fully outlines NCHS's college search and application process. Keep it handy and refer to it throughout the process. It's an essential resource for juniors and seniors! ELECTRONIC TRANSCRIPTS

SENIORS: Make sure your final high school transcript gets to the college of your choice! Log-in to your Parchment account to request your transcript to be sent, and select "hold for grades." If you have not set up a Parchment account, go to www.parchment.com and select the college you will be attending.



JUNIORS: APPLY TO COLLEGE EARLY

Colleges generally have their online applications for admission available over the summer - usually around mid-July. The Common Application goes live August 1, but you can begin working on it now and "rollover" the information in August. See their website for instructions on how to do that. Your guidance counselor will need some North Central forms from you in the fall, illustrated on pages 21-29 of The College Handbook. Counselors will begin accepting these forms on Friday, August 17.

- * For grades 4-12, two doses of Hep A are recommended.

Grade 12

- 3 Hep B
- 5 DTAP
- 4 Polio
- 2 MMR
- 2 Varicella
- 1 Tdap (Tetanus & Pertussis)
- 2 Hep A
- 2 MCV4 (Meningococcal Conjugate)
- 2 MenB (Meningococcal B) recommended

All doses must be valid doses. Live vaccines may be administered on the same day but must be at least 28 days apart if given on different days. Vaccines must be administered at the intervals determined by CDC guidelines to be considered valid. If you have any questions, please contact your student's healthcare provider, Marion County Health Department or Nicole Cooper, Supervisor of Health Services MSDWT.
