#### REGISTER WITH NAVIANCE

North Central Guidance encourages all students to register with NAVIANCE, a free internet-based college search management program. Juniors and seniors will find it the most helpful, but freshmen and sophomores

can use it to begin their college planning and career exploration and to begin building resumes.

#### Using NAVIANCE requires:

- Current e-mail address (please notify the Guidance Office of new e-mail addresses)
- Registration code, which will be e-mailed to students (also available in the Guidance Office)
- Once you have your registration code, register at http://connection.naviance.com/northcentral as a new user on the upper right side of the screen.

SIGN UP FOR COLLEGE MEETINGS: Juniors and seniors will use the program to sign up for meetings with college representatives visiting North Central in the fall. Just log in, click on the 'College' tab, and then click on 'view all upcoming college visits' on the right. As the visits are scheduled, they will appear under 'College Visits.'

#### COLLEGE COSTS

NC families are eligible to receive FREE personalized advice on making college affordable through the National Center for College Costs (NCCC). An NCCC representative will be available at Back-to-School Night on Monday, August 20, to answer questions about paying for college and to explain their college cost estimator. A follow-up workshop will be held on Wednesday, October 3 at which time individualized reports will be of your junior year. Applying to College for NC Seniors and Parents" on Wednesday, August 8 at 7 pm in the NC Auditorium.

Topics covered include: how to apply to colleges, getting NC transcripts sent to colleges, sending ACT or SAT scores to colleges, locating scholarship money, getting FAFSA help, meeting with college representatives, and requesting recommendations from counselors and teachers. We will offer tips on the essential pieces of the application process that all seniors applying to college need to know. Some processes are rather different this admission cycle and our goal is to help keep seniors and parents in the loop and help reduce the stress of applying to college.

> **SENIORS:** The Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship Application is available NOW. This Scholarship provides full tuition to any Indiana public or private college or university.

IF you live in Marion County, have a minimum GPA of 2.5, along with rigorous coursework and a high level of documented community service plus involvement in school activities, pick up an application in the Guidance Office. Open to undocumented students as well. Application packets are due August 8. 2018 at 3 pm in Mrs. Stroke's office.

Its time to complete those college applications! You can begin submitting your online applications now, even if you have not taken the ACT or SAT yet! Your counselor will begin accepting college application forms for processing on Friday, vour August 17.
