Dear North Central Families.

At North Central High School we take pride in the fact that we are an authorized International Baccalaureate (IB) school district grades K-12. IB requires that in year 5 (grade 10) of the Middle Years Program (MYP), all students in grade 10 undertake a Personal Project. The Personal Project provides students with the opportunity to plan, execute and reflect on an individual project of personal interest. Engagement in the process will help students develop organizational and learning skills that will serve them as they complete their high school education and move forward into their futures.

NCHS has identified four early release days during which Washington Township staff will provide sophomores with guidance and support here at school for the Personal Project. We will dismiss the freshmen, junior and senior classes early as we focus our efforts on supporting sophomores as they embark on the Personal Project. Early release dates are: Thursday, September 20; Thursday, November 1; Thursday, January 31; Thursday, March 21. However, as the Personal Project is not necessarily connected to a specific class, much of the work will be done at home after school has ended.

The Personal Project is not a small undertaking and it will take our entire community to support our students as they explore their creativity. This endeavor will shape the culture of our school as students go beyond the traditional confines of learning and personalize learning to their individual curiosity and interests. As this is a school-wide activity, it is an expectation that every sophomore be in attendance during the early dismissal days and will put forth their best effort in completing their project.

The Personal Project is an opportunity for all students to be successful. As this is our first full deployment of the Personal Project, I am enthusiastic about how this opportunity will shape our

students and community. I especially look forward to the exhibition in the spring when students will have the opportunity to showcase the products that were the result of their own creativity and hard work.

COLLEGE - CAREER COUNSELING

COLLEGE APPLICATION TIPS

- · Colleges will accept either the SAT or the ACT. Try both!
- You don't have to wait to apply until you've taken the SAT or ACT.
- It's also okay to apply if you haven't visited campus yet.
- The Common Application (<u>www.commonapp.org</u>) allows you to complete one application and send it to multiple member colleges. The list of their 500+ member colleges is on their website.
- Search College Board's website (<u>www.collegeboard.org</u>) to research colleges, majors and careers, and scholarships.
- DO NOT apply Early Decision (ED) if you haven't visited. If you are admitted ED, you have committed to attend.
- Some out-of-state colleges may be easier to get into & more affordable than in-state.
- Fall Break is the perfect time to visit colleges. Make appointments for an admission presentation and a campus tour, and be sure to cancel if you can't make it.

CAMPUS VISIT

Academic programs and activities are hugely important, but students also have to feel comfortable and be able to picture themselves on campus. Juniors and seniors are allowed two excused absences to visit colleges. Here's what they need to do:

- Pick up a green Campus Visitation form from the Attendance Office
- 2. Get a parent's signature and then Assistant Principal Mrs. Corn or Ms.Palacios signature.
- 3. Get each of your teachers to sign the form & list make-up work.
- 4. Make an appointment with the college for an admission posted on the NC presentation and a campus tour. Some schedule appointments on Saturday mornings. This can be done on their website or by phone.
- 5. If given the opportunity to meet a faculty member, ask what's unique about their program, their internships and their job placements upon graduation.
- Bring back a letter from the college visited stating you were there for a visit.

COLLEGE APPLICATION HELP FOR SENIORS

The NC Counselors will be assisting Seniors with online college applications, sending transcripts through Parchment, Naviance access, registering and sending scores for ACT or SAT and providing feedback on college application essays, resumes and more! Thursday sessions: August 30, September 6, September 13 and September 27 from 2:45-3:35 pm. in the Upper Information Center PC Lab. These sessions are designed to meet the needs of seniors who need time to work and to ask Counselors college application questions.

REGISTER WITH NAVIANCE



North Central Guidance encourages all students to register with NAVIANCE, a free internet-based college search management program. Juniors and seniors will find it the most helpful, but freshmen

and sophomores can use it to begin their college planning and career exploration and to begin building resumes.

Using NAVIANCE requires:

- Current e-mail address (please notify the Guidance Office of new e-mail addresses)
- Registration code, which will be e-mailed to students (also available in the Guidance Office)
- Once you have your registration code, register at http://connection.naviance.com/northcentral
 as a new user on the upper right side of the screen.

SIGN UP FOR COLLEGE MEETINGS: Juniors and seniors will use the program to sign up for meetings with college representatives visiting North Central in the fall. Just log in, click on the 'College' tab, and then click on 'view all upcoming college visits' on the right. As the visits are scheduled, they will appear under 'College Visits.' We no longer utilize paper sign up forms for meetings.

We have new procedures in place to connect with colleges.


College visits and presentations at NC: Naviance "College Visits"



- Essential information on visits:
- Seniors and Juniors must register for college admission presentations at NC online through Naviance.
- Go to the "Colleges" tab in Naviance Student and select "College Visits."
- Students have up to 48 hours (2 school days) in advance of presentation to register.
- NC teachers have final say in whether or not students may miss class time to attend college rep visits.
- No longer: We no longer issue paper passes to students to attend college admission presentations.
- Students sign-in at a college admission presentations verifying attendance.

PARENTS THREE IMPORTANT OPT OUTS



- 1) Internet usage forms signed by parents are no longer required. Use of the internet will be allowed for all students unless parents state in writing to the principal that they DO NOT wish their student to have internet access.
- 2) Seniors' names and social security numbers will be included in a report to the State Student Assistance Commission of Indiana in April 2019 verifying that they have earned a Core 40 and/or Indiana Academic Honors diploma, allowing them to receive state financial aid for college. Parents who DO NOT want their senior's name or social security number released to SSACI for financial aid eligibility must put that request in writing to the student's counselor.
- 3) A provision in the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) requires schools to provide the military with student names and contact information.
