The Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship Application is available NOW. This Scholarship provides FULL TUITION to any Indiana public or private college or university.

Criteria:

Live in Marion County

Minimum 2.5GPA (seeking rigor, academic success, and academic progress)

Demonstrate financial need

Demonstrate motivation and/or a high level of responsibility throughout your school, community, family, employment, and/or extracurricular activities

Open to undocumented students as well

Application packets are due August 8, 2019 at Noon in Mrs. Stroke's office.

OPT OUTS

Internet usage forms signed by parents are no longer required. Use of the internet will be allowed for all students unless parents state in writing to the principal that they DO NOT wish their student to have internet access.

Seniors' names and social security numbers will be included in a report to the State Student Assistance Commission of Indiana in April 2020 verifying that they have earned a Core 40 and/or Indiana Academic Honors diploma, allowing them to receive state financial aid for college. Parents who DO NOT want their senior's name or social security number released to SSACI for financial aid eligibility must put that request in writing to the student's counselor.

A provision in the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) requires schools to provide the military with student names and contact information. If you do not want your child's name released, contact:



THE PERSONAL PROJECT

The MYP (Middle Years Program) Personal Project exhibition occurred last April. Over 750 students exhibited making North Central's Personal Project Exhibition the largest exhibition in the country and perhaps even the largest in the world. Both completion and exhibition of 10th grade students'

project has become part of North Central culture. Projects ranged from family recipe books, to personal stories about and pictures of refugee camp experiences, to computer creations. The energy and excitement in the areas in which the exhibitions took place was palpable. At the beginning of every year, the staff looks forward to seeing what our sophomores will research and produce. Remember that this is a project that allows sophomores to pursue an individual interest under the supervision of either a member of our faculty or administration. This year's first early release day is August 29th. Soon, all sophomore families will receive a letter listing:

- the early release dates and exhibition date
- the various aspects of the project
- the consequences for failing to complete the project

This year is a special year for North Central's MYP. A team from IB (International Baccalaureate) will be returning to our district from September 25 to September 27 to evaluate the MYP program that includes grades 6-10. The team is here to ensure that we are meeting IB requirements and that the program has been successfully implemented in our building in grades 9 and 10 and in our three middle schools. We began preparation for this visit last year by filling out a 140 page document. Their visit will help ensure that we are implementing their program with fidelity while also helping us identify the areas in which work is still needed. The MYP continues to be a positive influence on our students and staff as we all strive to embody the ten Learner Profile attributes identified by IB: inquirers, risk-takers, caring, knowledgeable, principled, reflective, thinkers, balanced, communicators and openminded.
