STUDENT APPOINTMENT PROCEDURE

Parents or guardians should call the Attendance Office at (317) 259-5355, Ext. 45556, and leave a detailed message of absence or scheduled doctor's appointment. (Notes will not be accepted). It is the STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY to pick up the green pass from the attendance office. Passes can be picked up during passing periods or lunch periods. It is NOT school policy to interrupt class time. When the student acquires the green pass, s/he may leave the building to meet the parent or guardian for the appointment at door #1. Return proof of appointment to the Attendance Office. This information can be found on Page 107 of the Student Calendar and Handbook.

ABSENCES

For state reporting, absences from school are counted as periods missed:1-3 class periods missed counts as 1/2 day absence, 4-7 class periods missed counts as a full day of absence from school. Students who are absent for any reason are expected to obtain assignments from North Central's Homework Hotline. The number to call is (317) 259-5355, then your teacher's extension. PREARRANGED ABSENCES

A Prearranged Absence Form (pink) is required. This should be used if a student needs to be:

- Out of town for a Wedding
- · Religious conference
- Family vacation
- Absent for any reason which does not constitute an excused absence

Forms may be picked up from Attendance personnel prior to the dates absent, and must be completed and turned in to an administrator 3 days prior to his/her absence.

THERE WILL BE NO PROVISION FOR PREARRANGED ABSENCES:

- DURING THE FINAL WEEK OF ANY GRADING PERIOD
- FOR ANY CLASS DURING SUMMER SCHOOL
- DURING THE WEEK OF OR PRIOR TO OR FOLLOWING A SCHOOL VACATION PERIOD.

It is the decision of the school administrator to determine if a prearranged absence will be granted.

INSTANT SAT PRACTICE TEST SCORING: Simulate test day and take the SAT. Online Practice Test Link: https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat/practice/full-length-practice-tests
Then—for the first time ever—take a picture of your answer sheet and get an instant score.

Here's how Scan and Score works: Take a complete SAT practice test, using the official answer sheet to bubble in your answers. Open Daily Practice and activate your phone's camera. Keeping the app open, scan your answer sheet with your phone's camera and there it is in seconds: your score. Scores are saved so you can track your progress. Next, dig into the question-by-question details, then connect to Official SAT Practice at Khan Academy® for personalized study.

TAKING ACT & SAT?

Remember that while the majority of Indiana colleges and universities don't require the optional Writing Test for either the SAT or ACT, it's a good idea to check specific college websites and verify. Some colleges outside of Indiana may require one Writing Score from either ACT or SAT. If this is the case, students should plan to add the Writing Test just once - not multiple times.

COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAM

Testing is available on Sundays after the national testing dates at Hasten Hebrew Academy for students unable to test on Saturdays for religious reasons. Seating is on a first come first served basis. *NC is a host test site on these dates. Register on line at: www.sat.org or www.actstudent.org






