



SAT/ACT Test Dates

- Students must register online
- Both exams are accepted at all colleges and universities
- Most colleges will use whichever score is highest between the two
- Send scores to colleges upon registration
 - Four free score sends at time of registration
 - Fee if sending scores later






**Each college will have a different admission policy and certain required courses – these requirements differ from high school diploma requirements!



Paying For College

- What is financial aid?
 Financial aid = grants, work study, loans
- How do I qualify for financial aid?
 In order to qualify for financial aid, the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) must be completed during the fall of senior year

- Workers benefit from apprenticeships by receiving a skillsbased education that prepares them for good paying jobs



- Minimum 2.5GPA required


