

Dual Credit Opportunities at North Central High School

I. Advanced Placement

This program is offered by *College Board*. Students select from different courses over their four years at NCHS. AP courses, in most cases, are assessed in May via one examination. Students that earn a 3, 4, or 5 on the exam *might* earn college credit with that score. Often, this college credit will come without a grade, so there is no effect on their college GPA.

II. Advanced College Project [ACP]

This program is run in conjunction with Indiana University, Bloomington. Students sit in NCHS classrooms, but are taught via an IU syllabus. Students in this course are assessed by tests, quizzes, projects, homework, etc. The grade the student earns in class will count for both their NC grade, and their IU college course grade. This grade **will go** on their college transcript. It will apply to their GPA **if they attend any IU campus**. How it is counted at other schools is determined individually by those schools.
