Review financial aid offers, FAFSA deadline(s), regular applications

Key dates for seniors



KEY DATES FOR SENIORS

August – September: Research, remaining testing, and begin to apply early

- College apps open August 1
- Counselors begin processing College App Transcript Requests August 19
- Register for the SAT/ACT (*if needed*)
- Generate list of colleges
 - *Factors to consider: major, location/type, extracurricular activities, admissions, cost*
- Visit college campuses—schedule visits on college websites
- Visit a college rep at NC—sign up in Naviance in advance to attend session
- Research estimated cost of attendance
- Apply for scholarships
- Ask teacher(s) to write you a letter of recommendation for schools that require rec letters

October – December: Remaining testing, applications, and financial aid steps

- **OCTOBER 1** is the internal deadline for college applications to be submitted in order to be processed by November 1
- October 1: FAFSA available
- Register for the SAT/ACT (*if needed*)
- Continue to apply to schools
- Continue to apply for scholarships
- Completing the FAFSA before the holidays is ideal for getting financial aid packages back quickly

January – April: FAFSA deadline(s), regular applications, and outside scholarships

- Continue to apply for scholarships—many scholarships available at this time
- Compare financial aid packages as you receive them from colleges—use the College Comparison Chart that can be found on the Counseling Canvas Page
- Many Regular Decision college app deadlines during this time
- Decisions on where students will attend are typically due May 1

The College Application Process



From [start](#) to [finish](#)!

Step 1: Figure out which platform you will be using



College Application

Apply directly to the school from the college's website



Common App

Create a **free** account
Over **900 colleges** on Common App - allows you to fill out same general information only once



Common Black College Application

Apply to dozens of HBCUs for a single \$20 fee
Over 60 member institutions

Step 2: Figure out which type of application is best for you



Non-Restrictive Application Plans

REGULAR DECISION

Students submit an application by a specified date and receive a decision in a clearly stated period of time.

ROLLING DECISION

Institutions review applications as they are submitted and render admissions decisions throughout the admission cycle.



EARLY ACTION

Students apply early and receive a decision well in advance of the institution's regular response date.

Commitment: Non-Binding

Restrictive Application Plans

RESTRICTIVE EARLY ACTION (REA)

Students apply to an institution of preference and receive a decision early. They may be restricted from applying ED or EA to other institutions. If offered enrollment, they have until May 1 to confirm.

EARLY DECISION (ED)

Students make a commitment to a first-choice institution where, if admitted they definitely will enroll. The application deadline and decision deadline occur early.

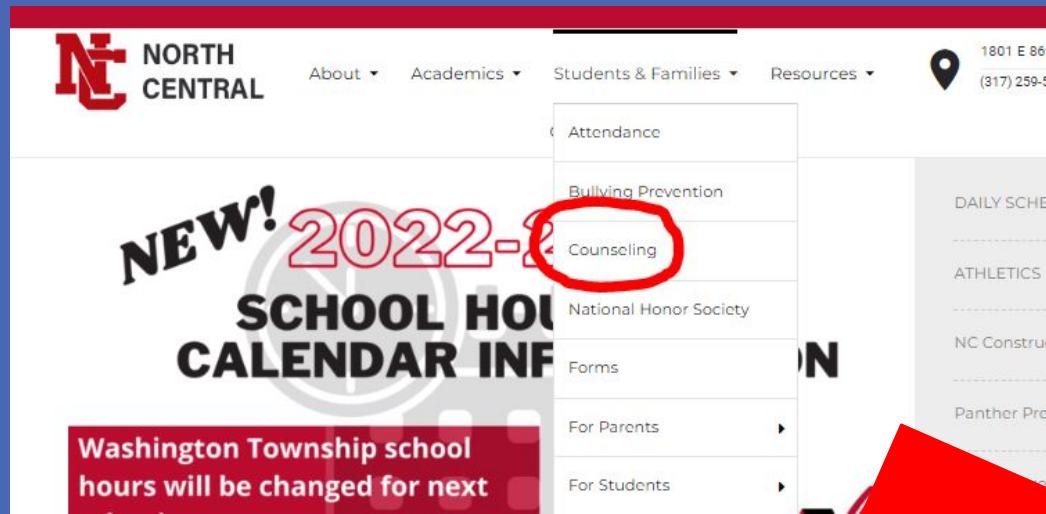

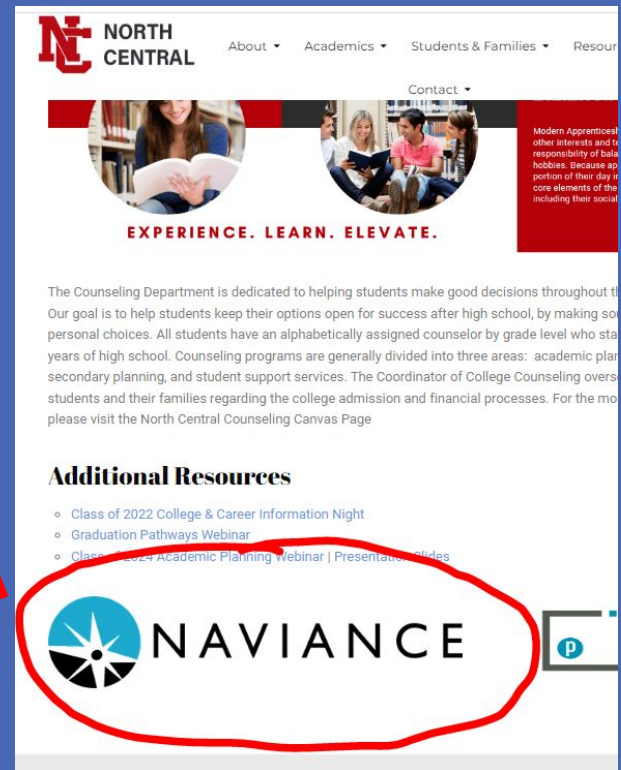

- ❑ If your personal email address is already in Naviance, select **Forgot Password** to receive a temporary password that will be sent to your inbox
- ❑ If you do NOT have an email address in Naviance, email Mrs. Stroke (Lstroke@msdwt.k12.in.us) or Miss Salazar and ask us to add your email address to Naviance.

FAFSA - Free Application for Federal Student Aid



Must be completed in order to receive any type of **institutional/state scholarship, grant, or loan** for college

FAFSA becomes available **October 1, 2022**

FAFSA Deadline: check with each individual college



Grants

Need-based money without repayment



Scholarships

Merit or performance-based money without repayment



Work Study

Need-based campus jobs; earning go toward tuition, fees, etc.



Federal Loans

Money you borrow and must be paid back with interest
