The Work-Based Learning team maintains the job board with opportunities in many industries and career fields, as well as updates and communications regarding career exploration events at NCHS and in the community. This is a free resource for students and NCHS families to connect to local employers.

<u>Let's do Lunch Career Series:</u>

Not sure what career areas interest you the most? <u>Modern Apprenticeship Program</u>

NCHS is a participating school with <u>EmployIndy's Modern Apprenticeship Program</u>! This 3-year program gives students an opportunity to work for some of the top employers in Indianapolis, including Roche, OneAmerica, Eli Lilly, Lenex Steel, and numerous others. Students will learn valuable skills that can be applicable to almost any career field, while earning great pay (\$13/hr on average), growing their professional network, and satisfying the Graduation Pathway requirements. Students apply for apprenticeships in their Sophomore year, then begin working in their Junior year. The final year is completed after graduation and can be completed in conjunction with a degree or certificate program! To be eligible, students must:

- -be on track to graduate with their class
- -have a flexible schedule to allow for early release during 9th and/or 10th period to go to the job site
- -have transportation to the job site

An information meeting will be held for interested students and their parents/guardians on December 5, 2022, at 6:30pm in the Performing Arts Classroom. More details will be shared via ParentSquare in the near future.
