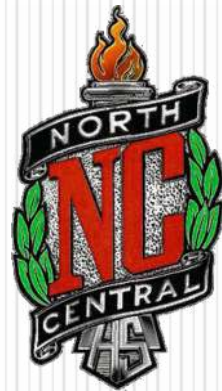

MSDWT MISSION STATEMENT

Science	6 credits	Biology, ICP, 2 addnl. Science credits
Social Studies	6 credits	Geography and History of the World or W. History, US History, Government, Economics
Health	1 credit	
Physical Education	2 credits	1 traditional PE credit required
Electives	17 credits	Explore career interests or possible college majors
Total	46 credits	

Adding Rigor

Students must take a Math or Quantitative Reasoning course each year in high school

Panther Exploration Project

All 10th graders will undertake an independent personal exploration project
The project will be the student's design and choice

The project will encourage and allow students to think critically and demonstrate creativity

Graduation Pathways

Students can now individualize their graduation requirements to align with their postsecondary goal.

Students will follow a pathway that meets their educational interest and prepares them for postsecondary educational or career opportunities

Employability Skills

Examples of employability skills are:

- Problem-solving
- Time management
- Decision making
- Independence

Students can meet this requirement in one of three ways

Employability Skills

Project Based Learning

- Challenging problem or question
- Sustained Inquiry
- Student voice and choice

- NC's Panther Exploration Project meets this requirement

Employability Skills

Service Based Learning

- Meaningful Service
- Service must be linked to Curriculum
- Service is student's choice

Employability Skills

Work Based Learning

- Authentic Work Experience
- Assessment and Recognition of Skills
- Partnership agreement

Postsecondary Ready Competencies

Earn specific benchmarks or test scores

Obtain credential or certification from state approved list

AP/IB/DC courses- 'C' average in at least 3 courses

CTE Concentrator- 'C' average in 2 advanced CTE courses in a particular program of study

Federally recognized apprenticeship
