- We will also be sending a similar form to your student so they can provide us with their perspective on their high school/life experiences.



NC College Bootcamp Sessions: College Admission Boot Camp is the opportunity to get a head start on your college process. During the half day session students will learn about Xello, our new college/career management system, create their Common App account, get some financial aid tips and hear some words of wisdom from college admission reps. **Sessions will be held on July 10, 16, 17 and 18**.  \rightarrow Should I take the SAT and/or ACT? Although there are some colleges that are allowing students to apply "test-optional", we still recommend that students take the SAT and ACT. This best prepares the student to apply to all colleges and universities and allows them to see if their test scores may enhance their application. It will also cover them in case there are certain scholarships that require test scores to be submitted. See the list of this school year's SAT and ACT test dates and associated

deadlines <u>here</u>. Please remember that all students who receive Free/Reduced lunch can receive test fee waivers to take both the SAT and ACT for free.
